




Extrajudicial killing

TORTURE TO DEATH (35 +)

Torture during interrogation and detention

- Dead bodies returned on the next day
- Family were informed the death with other reasons for death
- No formation from authority but other source



Death Sentence during Coup

64 sentenced to death

2 underage children (transferred to juvenile court) 18 from South Dagon **34** from North Okkalapa **5** from Shwepyitha **7** from Hlaingthaya

International Human Right Standards on Death Sentence

Cases

Death sentences were swiftly passed by military courts Unavailability of legal defence for the accused Prosecution was conducted by the correction department officers from respective prisons

Right to Life. Universal Human Rights Declaration Article (3) **Right to Life. International Convenant on Civil and Political Rights Article 6**

The penalty can only be carried out pursuant to a final judgement rendered by a competent court. ICCPR Article 6 (2) Amnesty, pardon or commutation of the sentence of death may be granted in all cases. ICCPR Article 6 (4) Death sentence under Penal Code Section 302 shall not be passed without due legal defence or in absence of the accused






LGBTIQs in Myanmar Spring Situations of LGBTIQs in Spring Revolution




LGBTIQ currently under detention (45 arrested in total)












Press under attack: The police chase a photo journalist during a crackdown of anti-coup protest in Yangon in February.




Military Attacks on Civilians Violence against Civilians after 1 February 2021

Casualties by Types of Attacks






